FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### **Happy October**

October contains a scary holiday. Here are a few corny jokes about it:



- A. You use a skeleton key.
- Q. What is a ghost's favorite ride?
- A. The roller ghoster.
- Q. What do you call two witches sharing an apartment?
- A. Broommates.
- Q. Why didn't the skeleton go to the prom?
- A. He had no body to go with.

Okay, that's probably more than enough. October is when we get to celebrate some of the spookier, scarier things in life. Often we make fun of them to lighten their effect. Sometimes we put ourselves in situations that give us a scare like watching a horror movie or going to a haunted house where creepy things jump out at us!

This October we return to worship inside, and the very real *monster* of Covid-19 and its Delta variant are actually out there threatening us. 26%+ of cases lately are children, and members of our church have shared with me that they know friends who have died of this disease even after being fully vaccinated. Other members of our church have caught the variant despite being vaccinated, and despite only mild symptoms, have had to quarantine so as not to pass it along to anyone else. We have members with asthma, heart conditions, cancer and more who attend worship, so the Session has decided to err on the side of being overly-cautious to minimize the risks as much as possible.

We begin October 3rd back in the sanctuary for worship, and we've decided that we'll all wear a mask (except those leading worship when speaking) and continue social distancing in the pews. That means a max of 52 in the sanctuary. We are allowed to sing and read responsively, so that means our worship will include all of its regular elements.

And during Coffee Hour, we will go over and meet for it in the Fellowship Hall, but with kids around (who will have had their snack during Sunday School so will be masked during Coffee Hour) we adults will continue to wear our masks there except when drinking our coffee—but you must please do so at a table.

Yes, we're not *fully* back to how we'd like to worship and enjoy fellowship, but let's minimize the risks as much as possible for the sake of the vulnerable. "As much as you did it to the least of these, you did it to me," says our Savior. This is an opportunity to practice caring for and courtesy to our own vulnerable members as training for how we relate to those outside our church, so that we may all have a happy October (and beyond).

NJ DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH - Pfizer booster doses are now available in New Jersey for 65+

and high-risk individuals. If you are 65 or older, a long-term care resident, an adult with underlying

medical conditions, or an adult at increased risk of COVID-19 exposure because of your job, you are now eligible for a Pfizer booster shot, at least six months after your second Pfizer shot. Vaccine appointments can be made at any existing vaccination location without a prescription.

The CDC has announced they are evaluating the available data with urgency to make additional recommendations for people who got the Moderna or Johnson & Johnson vaccines, as well as for other groups of people.

## RECIPE OF THE MONTH

#### **SLOPPY JOES**

#### Ingredients:

2 Tbsp. unsalted butter

1 medium onion, diced

1 green bell pepper, diced

1 clove garlic, minced

1 lb. lean ground beef

1 1/3 C tomato sauce

3/4 C ketchup

2 Tbs. brown sugar

2 Tbs. Worcestershire sauce

1 Tbs. yellow mustard

1 Tbs. red wine vinegar

1 tsp. smoked paprika

Pinch of cayenne pepper

Kosher salt & pepper

6 hamburger buns, toasted



#### Directions:

Melt the butter in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add the onions and peppers and cook, stirring occasionally, until softened and starting to caramelize in some spots, 6 to 7 minutes. Add the garlic and cook, stirring, until fragrant, about 1 minute. Stir in the beef and cook, breaking up the meat with a wooden spoon or spatula, until it is browned, no longer pink in the middle and cooked through, 7 to 8 minutes.

Stir in the tomato sauce, ketchup, brown sugar, Worcestershire sauce, mustard, red wine vinegar, paprika, cayenne pepper, 1 teaspoon salt and a generous amount of black pepper and simmer, stirring occasionally, until thickened and heated through, 5 to 6 minutes. Spoon the meat onto the toasted buns and enjoy!
