

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

LEAVIN' ON A JET PLANE

Have you ever wanted to go somewhere but it always seemed out of reach? Where is that place for you? A Caribbean island? The home country of your ancestors? Perhaps just a place you've wondered about and never been to? Perhaps it's somewhere here in this country or perhaps somewhere abroad?

About the time you read this, Kay and I will be flying over to the Holy Land. I've been a Christian all my life: baptized, Sunday School, Confirmation Class, Youth Group, Sunday Worship, etc., so I've heard about the places Jesus traveled, and they've always been foreign words to me in some sense: Judea, Samaria, the Jordan River, Bethlehem, Nazareth, the Sea of Galilee, and on and on.

So prior to the Pandemic I began making plans to travel to the Holy Land. This would have been in the fall of 2019. I got in touch with a guy who arranges sabbaticals and pilgrimages and we began making plans. He offered to arrange for us to go to Israel, rent a car, have a personal guide, and drive around seeing the sights. We could plan our own itinerary and go when and where we wanted to go.

I said no thank you. I've never been there before and have no idea how to get around Israel. There are Jewish areas, Palestinian areas, Muslim areas, and Christian areas, and some are off-limits to tourists. Instead, I asked to be a part of a group that has their bus, meals, sleeping accommodations, and itinerary all pre-arranged. He was willing to do that, and soon put us in touch with a Presbyterian church group from Austin, TX, who was planning to go in 2020. and had an opening for us Perfect!

And then the Covid-19 virus hit and all plans were off. But not actually off, just in hibernation. We were back on for our planning as of last fall, and everything has fallen in place since then. We will be traveling with the Hope Presbyterian Church of Austin, who have 25 going, along with their pastor. Kay and I will join them as fellow Presbyterians who want to experience the Holy Land for the first time.

The past 4 Thursday nights we've been Zooming together in studying the history of the area, its many religions, and the current political realities. Turns out Presbyterians from just about anywhere are really nice people, and we're all looking forward to this adventure.

So we're wheels-up on the 2nd and will be walking in many of the places Jesus did for 10 days. I'll try to post some pix on Facebook along the way, but that might depend on the internet. We'll definitely share our experiences when we return. Please pray for our safety and that this trip truly opens our eyes and our faith in new ways. We'll see you soon! Fefferson L. Hatch

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

STUFFED CABBAGE

INGREDIENTS

- 1 large head cabbage
- 1 pound lean ground beef
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 small yellow onion, cut into rings
- 1 onion, finely diced
- ¾ cup cooked white rice
- salt and pepper to taste
- 1 (10.75 ounce) can condensed tomato soup



PREPARATION

- 1. Place cabbage head in freezer and freeze overnight. Remove from freezer, thaw and peel away leaves.
- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- 2. Combine the beef, egg, onion, rice, salt and pepper. Mix together well. Take a small handful and form into a small roll or ball. Place into the center of a cabbage leaf. Fold the sides of the leaf over and roll the ball up into the leaf. Place seam side down in baking dish. Continue until all of the filling is used up.
- 5. Mix together the soup with a 1/2 can water; pour over stuffed cabbage.
- 6. Bake uncovered at 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) for 1 hour; baste often with the sauce.


