# What a Year It Will Be!

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Happy New Year!

2023 looks to be an auspicious year for the church! Kay and I are still here until mid-February before retiring, but then Pastor Nancy Young will be filling the pulpit for about 3½ months. During that time the church will write up a job description for an Interim Pastor who we're looking to have onboard around June 1<sup>st</sup>. Then, over the next year one of the Interim's duties will be to help the church do a Mission Study that includes a number of factors: community description, missions undertaken and hoped for, duties of the incoming called pastor, and more

So that means you'll have 3 pastors in your pulpit this year: first me, then Pastor Nancy, and then your Interim Pastor. Sometime next year (2024) the church should be ready to call your next full-time pastor. Whoever you'll call is out there somewhere, being prepared to take on the duties and responsibilities of being your pastor, just as I was being prepared to come to Branchville prior to 1990.

How was I prepared? I'd done a year's internship (1981-82) in Michigan under a wonderful mentor by the name of Bob Battles. He met with me every week to go over how to do ministry – like doing a baptism, wedding, or a funeral, leading committees, writing sermons. I worked full-time at the church, and got on-the-job-training as a student pastor.

Once I graduated in 1983, I began ordained ministry in West Chester, PA, at a large downtown church as an Associate Pastor under Head of Staff Bob Young (Pastor Nancy Young's father-in-law). Since I wasn't a student any longer, Bob treated me as a colleague, but he was still a mentor to me in many ways, as I observed him running his staff meetings, leading Session meetings, preaching (at which he truly excelled), and in pastoral care (visiting the sick, counseling the bereaved, etc.). After 7 fulfilling years as an Associate Pastor, Kay and I decided to look for a church where I would be its pastor.

And here it is that I'm in my 33<sup>rd</sup> year at Branchville! I was prepared to take on the role of pastor with the help of a couple of Bobs, a lot of wonderful parishioners, along with the welcome I received in Branchville. I believe God prepared me to minister here so that together we've been able to do some wonderful ministry over these decades.

So I suggest you begin now to offer prayers that God will be preparing your next pastor. She or he won't be here for about another year and half, so that's a good amount of time to be praying for her/him. Trust that it will happen in its own right time, that whomever you call will be the right person to lead you in both old and new directions, and that together you'll be an even greater witness to God's love in Branchville in the coming years. 2023 should be an auspicious year to begin preparing the soil for planting a new ministry here, in this wonderful church. 



#### **DECEMBER SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS (12/12)**

- The Fellowship Committee sent letters to those that have not participated in church over the past two year. In September eight names came off the roll by the member's request. By the end of December possibly 36 more names will come off the roll (we're waiting to hear if any responded to our 2nd letter inviting them to remain active).
- Pastor Jeff is meeting with our Administrative Assistant and videographer so that his retirement will be as smooth a hand-off as possible.
- The baptism of Joni Laurel Clawson and Mavis Jane Clawson was approved for January 29, 2023 for the daughters of Julie Anderson Clawson and Benjamin Clawson.
- The church received a \$25,000 gift from an anonymous donor.
- The Sunday School Christmas Pageant will take place on December 18th.
- The Sunday School students earned "Daisey Roe" dollars by relating acts of kindness and service they performed. They then took the Daisey Dollars to the Daisey Roe Pop Up Store (in the Nursery) where they chose gifts from the display that members of Daisey Roe set. It was a huge success! Many thanks to Nancy Clink who was the liaison for this project.
- The Fellowship Committee sponsored the Graham Cracker Village project in the Fellowship Hall on December 4th.
- The Fellowship Committee plans to hold a Cake-Walk fundraiser on Friday, February 10th. The proceeds from this will go to the quarterly mission.
- There will be carol singing on Christmas Eve at 7:15 pm followed by our candle-lighting service with Lessons & Carols at 7:30 pm.
- We will hold a Christmas Carol Sing on January 1st led by Mike Opilla, with Robin Van Dyk on organ.
- January 29th will be a Congregational Meeting preceded by a Potluck Lunch.
- February 12th will be the "Souper Bowl of Caring" mission, and Installation and Ordination of officers. It will also be Pastor Jeff's last Sunday with us.
- Tiger loops have been installed on the sanctuary boilers to remove air in the lines.
- A lot of the replaced lights from Room 4 have been re-used in other rooms in the Fellowship Hall.
- Our Stewardship Committee reports that so far 29 pledge cards have been returned.
   Over 50% of them have increased their pledge from last year, but we're hoping many more will be returned soon.



## RECIPE OF THE MONTH

## **Ham and Potato Soup**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 3 1/2 cups peeled and diced potatoes
- 3 1/4 cups water
- 3/4 cup diced cooked ham
- 1/3 cup diced celery
- 1/3 cup finely chopped onion
- 2 tablespoons chicken bouillon granules
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 5 tablespoons butter
- 5 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 cups milk



#### **PREPARATION**

- 1. Combine potatoes, water, ham, celery, and onion in a stockpot. Bring to a boil; simmer over medium heat until potatoes are tender, 10 to 15 minutes. Stir in chicken bouillon, pepper, and salt.
- 2. Melt butter in a separate saucepan over medium-low heat. Add flour; cook and stir until thick, about 1 minute. Whisk in milk; cook and stir until thick, 4 to 5 minutes.
- 3. Pour milk mixture into the stockpot; cook and stir until warmed through.
