

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Friends,

As I write this, I am preparing for my trip to Japan. Planning an international trip takes a lot of time and energy, as I have to shop, pack, book hotels, trains, and navigate a culture different than anything I've ever experienced before. While I am very excited for the trip, the preparation is taking a lot of time and energy.

We are fast approaching the next biggest season in the liturgical calendar: Lent. Lent begins February 18th, with the celebration of Ash Wednesday and runs for about 40 days, leading up to Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday.

Lent may not receive as much attention or excitement as Advent does, but it is no less important. It is a season of preparation, a season that encourages self-reflection and repentance so that we might be better prepared when we arrive on Easter Sunday, ready to greet the risen Christ.

While some people ignore Lent, others treat it as a season full of things they "have to do." I would like to flip the script a bit here. During Lent, we "get to" slow down and recenter on God. There is space for mourning, for doubting, for asking questions. There are times to come together with the church family that are not always present during ordinary time.

I'd like you all to try to see observing Lent as a privilege; an opportunity that only comes around once a year. Try and make the most of it. Come to Bible study. Join the choir or handbells. Take up your own personal practices of prayer and Bible readings. Make it a point to volunteer more. Reflect on your actions daily and pray for guidance in the days to come.

We are preparing for the journey to the cross. And like all journey's, it is one that is most fruitful when preparation is given.

Worship Notes

What's the deal with the affirmation of faith?

Some of you may have noticed that our affirmation of faith changes every single Sunday. Rest assured, there is a method to this madness!

The affirmation of faith follows the sermon and acts as a response to it. The congregation has heard the Scripture readings, and heard the pastor's own response to them and now it is their turn to react. By confessing their faith, the congregation links the message they have heard with their own faith and the traditions of the church.

The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) has a *Book of Confessions*, which acts as Part I of the denomination's constitution. The *Book of Confessions* contains twelve documents, a mix of creeds, catechisms, and treatises meant to encapsulate what it means to be a Reformed Christian. The documents span the length of time from the third-fourth century AD to the 1980s and act as guides to better understand God, the Church, and Scripture.

So why do we recite different ones each Sunday? Because there are gems hidden in each of the twelve documents. The authors of each one had different experiences with God, with humankind, and different reasons for writing down their faith. By incorporating a variety of faith statements, we have the chance to see both the breadth and the depth of Presbyterian faith.

There might be affirmations that speak to you more than others. This is a good thing! Consider why some words are more moving to you than others and see if that says something about your own faith. I personally enjoy bouncing around in the *Book of Confessions*, touching on ancient church creeds, catechisms from the Reformation, and modern statements of faith regularly. If we say an ancient creed on Sunday, you can anticipate that the next will be something more modern.

If you are curious about *The Book of Confessions*, it is available on the PCUSA website to read for free! And if you aren't curious, then I hope you can at least appreciate the excerpts we read from in worship each Sunday!


1ST QUARTER MISSION

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Cherry Pie Bars

INGREDIENTS

- 3 cups Purpose Flour (all)
- 1 cup Granulated Sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoon Cornstarch
- 1 teaspoon Baking Powder
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon Salt
- 1 cup Unsalted Butter (cold)
- 1 Large Egg
- Cherry Pie Filling

GLAZE:

- 1 cup Powdered Sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon Vanilla Extract
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon Almond
- 3 Tablespoon Milk



PREPARATION

1. Preheat the oven to 350°F. Grease a 9×13-inch baking pan and line it with parchment paper. Set aside.
2. In a large bowl, whisk the flour, sugar, cornstarch, baking powder, and salt to combine.
3. Add the butter and cut it in with a pastry cutter or rub in your fingers until crumbly.
4. Add the egg and mix until just combined. The dough should be crumbly but hold together in your hand when pressed.
5. Press about 2/3 of the dough evenly into the prepared pan and bake for 8 minutes. Remove the dish from the oven and pour the cherry pie filling evenly over the top. Sprinkle the remaining crust crumbs evenly on top.
6. Bake for 20-25 minutes or until golden brown and bubbly. Let cool in the pan.
7. For the glaze, whisk the powdered sugar, vanilla and almond extract, and enough milk to reach the desired consistency. Drizzle over the cooled bars.
